The Second Öresund Symposium on Clinical Skills Training

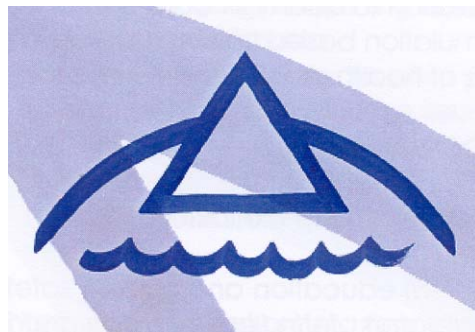

A commercial exhibition will be arranged.

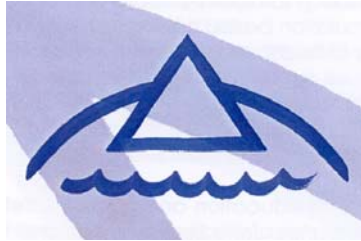
